About Lois Stark

Emmy Award-winning Lois Farfel Stark produced and wrote documentaries for NBC News, filming in Africa, the Middle East, Cuba, Northern Ireland, Europe, and throughout the USA. While based in Washington, D.C., she covered Abu Dhabi's catapult to the 20th century, the British withdrawal from the Persian Gulf, Cuba ten years after their revolution, the Israeli Air Force in the Six Day War, Northern Ireland during its time of religious conflict, and Liberia's social split. Her films have also focused on architecture, medical research, wilderness protection, artists, and social issues among her forty documentaries.

After moving to Houston she contributed to NBC Network News specials on healthcare and the American family. For KPRC-TV, she produced and wrote hour specials on globalization, urban growth, architecture, and medical research. Other commissions were for the National Conference of Mayors; the Skirball Museum in Los Angeles, and a Philip Johnson building.

Her films have won an Emmy, two CINE Gold awards, two Gold Awards from The International Film Festival of the Americas, the Matrix Award from Women In Communications, the American Bar Association Silver Gavel Award, and the Silver Award from the Texas Broadcasting Association. Two of her films on architecture were selected for exhibition at the American Center in Paris, France.

In civic affairs, she served as a Trustee of institutions in education, health, the arts, and public service. These include: Sarah Lawrence College, The Women's Leadership Board of Harvard Kennedy School for Public Policy, The Alley Theatre, Texas Children's Hospital, St. John's School, the Harry Ransom Center, the Rhodes Scholar Selection Committee for Texas, Humanities Texas, the Texas Committee on the Arts and Media, The Joseph Campbell Foundation, and the Federal Reserve Board of Dallas Small Business Council. She is a Fellow of the Texas Philosophical Society, The Center for Houston's Future, and American Leadership Forum. She has been honored for her civic contributions by The Alley Theatre, The Jung Center, the Anti-Defamation League, and named Outstanding Alumna of St. John's School.

She is a graduate of Sarah Lawrence College and has two Master of Arts degrees in Adult Education (Boston University) and Communication (American University).
